Dear Mr. Hall,

The chief purpose of this letter is to notify you, in advance of the coming calendar call in C.A. 75-0322, that I have not received all the records that supposedly were sent and that there are significant records within the request that have not been sent to me.

It was not possible for me to make a careful check of the enclosures as I received them. However, I have arranged for a college student to make this check. It discloses that enclosures were not complete as described. I expect to be able to write you further about this when that work is completed or, if not completed by then, in advance of this status call.

In some cases, when the FBI wrote me that I would receive certain information, and the file is an illustration, I did not get it. I did get a few, but then nothing. This applies to tapes also. You will find in your files a letter agreeing that both would be provided.

In one instance I was sent the wrong file. This is the wrong Hosty 67 file. I provided the number of the correct one and there is significant information in it. Hosty also has made himself very much of a public figure, particularly after retirement and with regard to the subject matter of the request.

I have identified Garrison files that remain withheld. Again, this is also an illustration because there are other pertinent files that remain unsearched even after I identified them and made specific request.

There is some overlap with my PA requests. With regard to records that were provided pertaining to an alleged mafia threat against Sir Garrison, as my documented appeal reflects, pertinent records clearly are missing.

For your information, the threat was relayed to me and I informed the New Orleans field office.
