JFK, PA requests

In DJ 129-11, Item 1456 as accounted from by the Criminal Division, in the middle of records pertaining to a "Mr. Hunt" letter signed Lee Oswald, there is a record stating that the FBI provided the information that I did not credit that business.

Any such record would be included within both my PA and JFK assassination requests and, if copies were sent to the field offices, as appears probable with Dallas at least, within that request and litigation.

I do not recall having been provided with copies of any such records.

The FBI's information is correct. I'm interested in the records and the FBI's source(s).

It happens that the FBI provided other information to the Department that it did not include in the files it disclosed. This means that it either did not disclose in full from the files searched or what is no less probable, that it did not search the proper files and filed outside the main JFK assassination files what it anticipated that it might not want to disclose or to have surface in the normal checking.

It also is apparent that the FBI had no difficulty in retrieving the information about me. It therefore should have no problem in providing copies now.
