Dear Mr. Weisberg:

This letter is to confirm that on November 18, 1977, several photographs depicting Dr. King's body after death and one photograph depicting the death bullet were reviewed by you at FBI Headquarters. As a result of your review, a photograph of the death bullet is herein being forwarded to you.

Also being forwarded are four Baltimore Field Office documents and one FBI Headquarters document, all of which pertain to photographs and an artist's sketch of alleged suspects in this case.

Additionally, we have received a response from the State Department regarding a consultation pertaining to their information in a Los Angeles document (44-1574-1403). This document is herewith being released to you with several excisions pursuant to 5 USC 552 (b) (7) (C).

One document (44-1987-Sub M-572) was forwarded to the United States Army Intelligence and Security Command for their determination regarding the releasability of their information contained therein. The result of their review is that this information should be withheld pursuant to 5 USC 552 (b) (1), (b) (7) (D), and (b) (7) (E). The FBI review of the remainder of the document resulted in a determination that the FBI portion of the document should be withheld pursuant to 5 USC 552 (b) (7) (C). This document is denied in its entirety. An appeal concerning the withholding of U.S. Army information within this document should be addressed to:
