Thank you for your letter stamp dated yesterday and for the three attachments.

There were two suits.

Whether or not these three records are full and complete, and I very much doubt it, I know there is no single page you have provided that is relevant to the second case.

You have merely released what the Civil Division has told you it found.

To my knowledge it has more.

To my knowledge the Navy has more.

There are records, for example, preliminary to a conference arranged by the Secretary of Defense in 1962.

There are records of the Navy agreeing for the Army to represent it in this matter.

There are records of my specific complaints about specific overflights.

There are also those records compiled in response to a discovery order. Although I was to have been provided copies none were provided. However, I was able to go over them.

We would appreciate what the law requires, a search in good faith and with due diligence.
