

The N.C. 5/8/77 airtel, Net Recorded, from 105-82555, also in 62-109060 and with illegible side notation for "original filed in", holds details I do not recall having read in any of the N.C. records provided in 76-00322 and other than I have name seen in response to my EA request. The attached LHM holds the info, and it has typical, selfserving FMI lies to cover the FML, as on page 2, that "arlos Guiroga "has in no way been affiliated with the CIA or the CHA." In fact N.C. carried him with a T number as a temporary informant and has confirmed this in writing, identifying him voluntarily.

Throughout the LHM, prepared for distribution and thus not containing information the FHI did not want distributed, there are details I do not recall from other H.O. records I've read, most likely because the underlying records where not filed in the Oswald or JFK files but were in the special "arrison files instead. (Nonetheless relevant because my request was for all records and made no mention of either the Oswald or JFK files.)

The paragraph referring to me also holds details I did not see in other N.O. versions. (It is my recollection that I did not receive this under any PA request but I'm not absolutely certain, meaning the other records, not this one.) I do not recall seeing what did not happen, that Bringuler had filed suit against Garrison and me. This also could not explain what is indicated, that "arrian would want to change his plans to lunch with Bringuier, Actually, Bringuier filed a spurious suit against Saga magzine and me over its reprinting of a chapter of Whitewash. It was, as Bringuier willingly boasted to the local press, a chance for some publicity. " got a Cuban lawyer to filed the case without charging bin. Later he joined Dell, and then the whole thing was tossed out of court. The suit in was baseless, did not even alleged any inaccurate reporting and there was none. There was no defenation of any kind and all came from the issume Warren Commission published mat/erials, quoted accurately. It was a typically crazy Bringsier operation. But it had no connection with Carrison. (The photos in which I was interested and had taken for no did not include the crazy Bringuier's place. ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY, DALLAS, TEXAS, KOVENBER 22, 1963

At 10:37 a. m. on April 6, 1967, Carlos Quiroga, 3134 Derby Place, New Orleans, Louisiana, appeared at the office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and furnished the following information:

Carlos Bringuier, an active anti-Castro Cuban, has been told by Alberto Fowler, investigator for District Attorney. James Garrison, that Garrison plans to serve a subpoena on the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), in order to make that organization produce a photograph which was supposedly taken by them of Lee Harvey Oswald-and a companion entering the Cuban Embassy in Mexico City. Fowler states that the individual accompanying Oswald is an agent of the CIA.

On April 22, 1967, Quiroga was interviewed by Hugh Aynesworth, correspondent of Newswock Magazine. Quiroga told Aynesworth everything he knew concerning the Garrison investigation and in turn Aynesworth advised him that the attorney of Alvin Beaubouef, former associate of David W. Ferrie who is one of the fligures in the Garrison investigation, has a tape recording of an investigator of Garrison's office offering a \$3,000 bribe to Beaubouef to change his testimony regarding Garrison's investigation. Garrison is reportedly aware that this tape recording exists and is new blackmailing Beaubouef with a photograph which shows he and David Ferrie engaged in sexual activities. Aynesworth indicated that an article oritical of Garrison's inquiry will shortly appear in Newsweek.

On April 29, 1967, Quiroga met with Walter J. Sheridan, correspondent for the National Broadcasting Company (NBC). Sheridan indicated to Quiroga that he was aware of the existence of the aforementioned tapo recording and they had attempted to acquire it from Beaubouef's attorney but the price wanted for it was too high. Sheridan stated that NBC plans a television program regarding the Garrison investigation.

Quiroga indicated that both of the above correspondents were directed to him by Sergio Arcacha Smith, a key figure in the Garrison probe and former Cuban exile leader in New Orleans. Quiroga advised them, as he had advised District Attorney Garrison's office when given a lie detector test, that he, in the past, has in no way been affiliated with the CIA or the FBI.

Quiroga advised that when the investigation by District Attorney Garrison first began he thought that Garrison might actually have something, but it is now his belief that Garrison's investigation is a witch hunt. Initially in the investigation, Quiroga made available to Garrison an album which he, Quiroga, and his wife had compiled regarding the, "Crusade to Free Cuba," in the New Orleans area. Since that time, names appearing in this album have continually appeared in the Garrison investigation.

Quiroga indicated that the, "Crusade to Free Cuba," was organized in New Orleans to raise funds among Cuban exiles and American citizens to fight against the Castro Government.

Bringuier advised Quiroga that Alberto Fowler had told him that Garrison wanted to have lunch with him in the coming week, but this may now be called off because Bringuier has filed a law suit against Garrison and Author Jack Wiesberg: Bringuier reportedly has photographs which he recently took of Jack Wiesberg; and a Garrison investigator taking photographs of Bringuier's bar, "La Habana," on Decatur Street in New Orloans

> Jack Wieberg g is the author of Whitewash.

Quiroga stated that he and his wife will travel to Texas in the next week, during which he will visit Arcacha Smith. Quiroga plans to question Arcacha Smith concerning his knowledge of munitions thefts from bunkers in the New Orleans area.

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
