Thank you very much for your letter of July 20 and the attachments.

Little by little all these who desied having any files are finding a fex. I regret that when as with whit you enclose they provide leads on other files these leads are not being followed.

Those records include the nemes of those I have in the past stated had files or knowledge of where relevant files were.

Some of these records confirm some of my can I have obtained recourtly. For example, Mr. Walter Herbert Horse on 5/9/73 had a clear recollection of turning all his records over to AGC (Logistics). He thought relevant records were in two other files "EAA" and Somic Boom Claims." How from the same people who long indisted they had no single record among these are Mr. Morse 11/29/63 turning over "all correspondence and memors." This is further confirmed by Mr. Steven Bergon. Then there is the 12/29/72 letter from Mr. Datid Briggs stating all records have been forwarded to the office of the U.S. Attermey in <sup>B</sup>altimore. This is precisely what <sup>1</sup> have said all along. But these records have not been provided. They should have been returned. This batch also reflects that as I said I was to have obtained these records under discovery. You will also find that copies were not given to me under discovery because you will find no record of it, no receipt.

If I have not cald it bafers - and I want to be specific when I have also been critigial - I think that what the Socretary did in these years to try to help us and what Mr. Horse as his representative did were fine.

In the discovery metion I have found the file number JAGD 62 - 10189. Can this help?

The few records you have just provided also supply names and other offices to be checked.

Mr. Morse's files were of about three large volumes. I never sew them on discovery. What I did see was 8-9" thick. If there had been normal practice with discovery I would have been given oppies and response would have been full. Noither happened, which leads to the present situation and the work antailed.

These records refer to some of sine never returned, like the pictures.

It should be becoming apparent to someone on your staff that in bits and pieces what I have reported is being confirmed. I hope this will be recalled in connection with the other matters. One some I enclose a few copies for your information because you are in your BoD role.

As I think I have told you Civil, Justice, has not responded to my request after an extraordinary length of time. There was partial response to a duplicating and more recent request by my wife. The records you have just provided trace DeD records within my request to Justice, Baltimore. They are DeD records and I do hope you will pursue them for me. By now they may be in the Archives building southeast of Washington.

I do thank you for persisting. I hope you will continue to de so. If you do protty such of thes may be recovered. Once you get to those records reflecting a determination to stonewall and to deceive higher authority as well as wrongful policy determinations at higher levels perhaps there may be a reward for Doll, which I do not believe really wants people treated as we were and as large sums of money were wasted to accomplish.
