On November 19, 1958, Harold and Lillian Weisberg filed a complaint (Civil Action Number 11036) against the United States Government in United States District Court, Maryland District, Baltimore, Maryland, under the Tort Claims Act, for \$9,950 damages allegedly sustained by them in their poultry business as a result of disturbance caused by lowflying Government-owned helicopters.

The complaint showed that they were joint owners of Cog d'or (Golden Rooster) Farm, 14-acre tract of land near Hyattstown, Maryland, on Route 109 between WS 240 and Maryland Route 355, on which they lived and operated the Cog d'or Farm. The principal business and source of revenue of the Cog d'or Farm was the raising of pheasant-chickens, Rock Cornish game hens, waterfowl, and other poultry and the sale of poultry and their eggs.

Our files also indicate that a book titled "Whitewash," relating to the assassination of President Kennedy, was written by one Harold Weisberg.
