Mr. Connally was present in the Presidential Motorcade, enroute from downtown Dallas to the Trade Mart on Stemmons Expressway. Mr. Connally was shot by an assailant in the near vicinity of the intersection of Elm & Houston Streets. Mr. Connally sustained a gunshot wound with the point of entry located in the posterior of the right shoulder, ranging downward thru the chest, exiting on the right chest just below right nipple. The bullet continued, striking the right wrist, palmside, exiting 2 inches from the wrist joint. A fragment continued, entering the anterior portion of the left thigh causing a flesh wound. Dr. Robert Shaw, chief of the Thoracic Surgery, Parkland Hospital, states that Mr. Connally's condition is favorable for recovery.
