

and these were direct quotes from Holloman because O'Neill used quotation marks in his report which indicated that he had written those precise words in his notes, which notes have since been destroyed after the report was dictated. SA O'Neill noted that Mr. Holloman did not repeat that language in the interview of November 27, 1963, and that in the later interview O'Neill took down what Holloman said without leading or directing him in any way.

I also asked the two Special Agents about the language in their reports that Greer glanced around and noticed that the President had evidently been hit and thereafter got on the radio and communicated with the other vehicles, stating that they "desired to get the President to the hospital immediately." SAs O'Neill and Elliott advised that to the best of their recollection SA Greer told them just that, but they probably did not make any notes on these comments since their conversation with Greer was an informal one at the time of the autopsy and they did not have an opportunity to make extensive notes in accordance with their normal interviewing procedures.
