

Citation from Noah Mason of "priveledge" of American League for Peace and Democracy list (vol. 10, p. 6403, beginning of hearing on October 25, 1939, first comment on the record after Dies called the committee to order, with Starnes, Voorhis and Mann ppresent):

Mr. Mason. Mr. Chairman, I make a motion that the Chair carry out instructions given in executive session yesterday, and that this statement and list be made a part of the record; so that it is a priveleged matter.

The list itself appears in this same volume on pp. 6404-6417. It is headed "Membership list", in spite of statements made by the committee that it was a membership and mailing list. PP. 6417-6426 contain communications of complaint from 21 persons whose names appear in the list.

Citation re Mrs. B.G.Lamberton, a teacher at the Eliot Junior High School: P. 6422, a letter from her to Dies, dated 10/26/39, in which she said that she never "had any contact" with the ALPD.

The Column "9 to 4:30", by Jerry Kluttz, appearing in the Washington News of 10/28/39, under the head "Shocking Injustices of Dies' Action cited, attributes to Congressman Dempsey the information that "parents of Mrs. Lamberton's pupils are demanding that she resign" her job as teacher.
