Here is a report on what I was able to accomplish this morning and this afternoon^(see notes).
Afternoon: In addition to the addresses you gave me, I would in all probability be able to obtain the answers to all the queries in your letter of 7/23/42 in the mail because I was wrong when I said they close down at 1 on Saturdays.

If I am I will do my best to get you some information on the Army.

The pamphlet "Military Service" is in the mail to you. It is a booklet which contains forms for the Army Specialists Corps. I'm told there is but one form

for entering (enclosed) and other forms are filled out, if needed, after entrance. This pamphlet contains a copy of the "Army Regulations on Moral Activities". Two copies are in the mail to you. This is a longer address, but I finally got the address from the superior officer who gave you the information. He took care of it himself and I am sure he is correct.

Air Corps Recruitment. This situation is similar to the Navy situation - report yesterday. The material being revised. I'm sending Yarmon what I have today, and when it is ready, send the new stuff when it is ready.

If possible, I am going to send him a copy of his material. I'm not hopeful he'll get it in time to do anything about it. It was suggested that it would be

a good idea and good protection before Yarmon to send a copy of his material to the Army Relations Office.

Public Relations Division, Public Relations Office, PAA, 712 Maritime Building, New York, N.Y. They will go over it and correct any mistakes and mail it back by the beginning of the day after receipt. Corrections have been made on the material I'm sending him.
