Dear Al:

Just a note to explain why you haven't yet received the Treasury piece. After revising it, I took it to the Treasury to be checked, and they have gone over it very carefully. They have just told me that they think they have something much better for us, and I am to go after this the beginning of the week.

I cannot now go into all the things that came up, but I am confident this substitution will not only be a better story but will protect you from carrying what may become a government campaign.

You should have this story by about the middle of next week. Should there be any delay, even a slight one, I will inform you.

By the way, in going over my books, I find that I neglected to take up with you the matter of the Italian stamp with Hitler's picture which you said you were going to use and for which you said you would pay me.

The Farm Security piece is taking shape and I probably will be able to give you details with the Treasury piece.
