Deputy Premier Kemal Satir told newsmen after the meeting:

"In view of actions by Greek Cypriot President Makarios undertaken to annihilate Turkish Cypriots around the Mansoura area, we contacted the United Nations and our allies for putting an end to this action. But we could not obtain any results. Turkish air force iets now are cleaning up all Greek Cypriot military vehicles on their way to annihilate Turkish Cypriots" near the Mansoura area.

At 7 p.m. Satir announced "The strafing has been going on now for one hour."

The Turkish government accused Greece of delaying the outcome of the Geneva talks on Cyprus to gain time to facilitate an all-out attack on the island.

List Steps Taken

The following decisions were taken at the Cabinet meetings; the communique said.

- The Turkish air force was put on a state of complete alert against possible aggression from Cyprus and Greece. Defensive and counterattack meaurse were taken on the border with the Greek province of Thrace along Turke's coasts facing the Greek islands, and in Cyprus. Preparations for aggression by the Greek side in Cyprus have been put under con-Turkish air recontinuous
- naissance. Turkey will be in readiness against any secret or open aggression.

At Iskenderun, an embarkation port on Turkey's southern cost, thousands of troops were put on a stand-by basis. They have been massed there since the start of the Cyprus troubles last December. More units moved into the City yesterday.

Witnesses reported the arrival of new infantry regiments, an armored brigade, field artillery batteries, army engineer and signal corps units, an antiaircraft regiment and commandos.

The bulk of Turkey's naval ships stationed here were away from port as the new troops arrived. A flotilla of 28 ships, including destroyers, submarines and mine sweep-

Port authorities stopped all arrivals and departures of merchant ships.
