Dear Mr. Summers:

In response to your December 30, 1978, letter, with enclosures, please be advised that both queries set forth therein were matters of mutual interest to the FBI and the former Select Committee on Assassinations, U. S. House of Representatives.

The FBI has furnished all retrievable information on both matters to the Committee and I would assume you will find both items treated appropriately in the Committee's final report which is expected by March 30, 1979.

In short, concerning your first query, personal identities are always of routine concern to FBI Agents in the execution of their duties and no specific instance of concern warrants any emphasis beyond its particular context.

Concerning your second query, retrievable information, to date, discloses no "tapes" were ever made available to the FBI. Your best source of information concerning the results of any "surveillance" of Lee Harvey Oswald in Mexico City, Mexico, would, of course, be the Central Intelligence Agency.


