I spoke to Lieutenant Schubert today relative to the material you requested of him. All that he had not previously sent you was today mailed to Yarmon, except three things that Lieut. S hasn't got:

Requirements for aviation ground crew- there is no answer to your question because men get there in the following manner: they try to become aviators and fail, then become part of the ground-crew personnel, or are sent to the ground crew as tehnnicians. There are no specific requirements.

Complete list of all army schools. There is none, so he says he can't send it. However, he says he has sent you all the dope on these schools.

Application forms for commissions. He has written you about this, he says. Army men are given this application forms by the Army Specialist Corps. The other information, he says, is in your hands.

The material sent to Yarmon told was too voluminous to make a list for you.

There were several pounds of it, consisting of pamphlets, releases, reports,

Senate Committee prints, etc. Except for the three things above, however,

it ism according to Lieut. S., everything you wanted of the Army.

I have been in touch with Riley Moore. After speaking to her I concluded you have no separate outline for the Marine Corps because you intend to use the Navy outline for them. Please correct me if this is wrong.
