I'm enclosing a check in accordance with your letter.


I feel unwilling to comment on the points you make, other than to clarify for you the points made by Merv Yarmen. He holds that payment ought to bear a relationship to results achieved; and that time spent can only be evaluated by the information obtained. Re two of his chapters--Marines and Coast Guard--little material was received. Hence his criticism.

Let me add : since speaking to you ~~Saturday night~~ last week, and since receiving your telegram and letter--I obtained a single pamphlet on the Coast Guard, a brochure on Cadet Training, of which I have a number of copies already.

This is, I believe, what Yarmen means when he speaks of failure to obtain results commensurate with the time paid for.
