I have a tentative okey on it at this end, and what remains is for us to think if there is anything in particular we want. I'm to get in touch with the press officer at the Soviet Embassy on this in the middle of next week, and I think we could get a good, different, personal story on the Red Army, the Soviet peoples and their resistance, and something on the cementing of relations between them and us, which is the purpose of his visit here and a delegate to Mrs. Roosevelt's ISS.
