Dear Mr. Fraysur:

Bob Rogers, former editor of Click, and I were discussing your magazine yesterday. While he was editing Click, I was his Washington representative. I had called him to find out something about you, my interest coming from your beat on the tank-trap-buster story (which I thought I had exclusive for another national picture magazine).

He and I have both noticed the considerable improvement in Spot since you took over. He suggested I write you because you might, at this time, want a representative in Washington.

If you are interested: I have been here since the New Deal, worked for the regular government and for the Senate (as an investigator and an editor), and since 1939 have represented various picture magazines here. Much of my work has been "ghosting" or arranging by-line stories by important government peoples, exposes, and, recently, armed-service stories.

Inclosed is a reprint of a story I did for Click about a year and a half ago. Since then this expose has been followed by investigations by committees of both the Senate and House of Representatives, and last week the Department of Justice announced an indictment of this company based upon the facts revealed in the story. Other stories of a similar nature I did for Click have been followed by like actions by the government.

Bob can probably tell you anything you might want to know about me or my work and connections, if you are interested.

Should you be, I will be very glad to answer any questions you might have, or, should you think we ought to have a talk, I can come up to New York.

Congratulations on the changes and improvements you have made in Spot.
