Dear Mr. Weisburg.

You are doing a work of justice, dignity and honor. You are righting a greivous wrong done to a lonely and friendless man. You are exposing the most widespread and infamous conspiracy in the history of our country. A conspiracy of such incredible magnitude that all of the top agencies of our government actively foster and abet in it. The chief justice of the Supreme Court, of all people, permits himself to be roped in by the fraud, and then, with the members of his commission and the staff lawyers and investigators, when the fraud is exposed for all to see, remain silent. Every member of congress remains silent. Life magazine actively participated in the flim-flam and gave wide circulation to the shabby work of the Dallas Police, faking the photo of Oswald with the pistol and the rifle. The press radio and T.V. helped to forster the hoax and now by a consensus of silence strive desperately to keep the lid shut tight on this exposure of their shameful behavior. The President's own brothers and friends, and his own wife, the mother of his children, are all silent in the face of this exposure and continue to permit an innocent man to be tagged with this murder. The more I think about it, the sicker I get.

You are speaking out for the millions of us who are inarticulate and who are appalled to think that such a thing could happen in our country. Please cash the check and use the money for whatever purpose you see fit. It is my way of showing my personal gratitude for the work that belongs to all of us, but which you and a few others are doing for us. I couldn't have put the money to a nobler use.

Just a suggestion: In as much as there are only two of you and you are loaded down with work, couldn't you contact the ACLU, The National Council of Churches, the N.Y. Board of Rabbis, and the B'nai Brit. These are all liberal organizations and because millions of people only know of the assassination as reported by the media and the Warren report, a way should be found to get the photographs, at least, into wider circulation. These organizations may be glad to share in the expense and also furnish clerical help for you. A short while ago the papers reported that a Rabbi, priest and minister jointly petitioned the President to re-open the investigation. Of course he turned them down. But these organizations could make the demand so great that he could scarcely resist.
