
I am returning your manuscript, herewith. I took it to Cape Cod with me over the weekend where I had a chance to read it. It is quite a remarkable paper. It contains a great number of statements and allegations that I presume you can support with the material that you have in your own possession. The support is not in the document itself. I would assume that if it were published the impact would be quite sensational. The material associated with Captain Brown was new to me, as well as a considerable number of other things that you write about.

I take it from your letter that you are anxious to have this manuscript back, and I am returning it herewith. I will, as you suggest, register it, valuing it at \$100.
