Dear Mr. Clapp,

Unless there is need to go to Baltimore, I'd prefer to avoid the time and the cost of the trip, especially if my wife's signature is required, because for the next month or so she is in tax school and this means both our mornings are occupied Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays.

Unless the interrogatory answers have to be notarized there, we can have it done here. I generally use the notary at our bank. I think at least one local lawyer is also a notary.

However, if you want us there, we will come. If you send the answers for notarizing here, I'd appreciate it if you include a self-addressed envelope. Most mornings now I pick up the mail at the post office. I would then go to the bank, execute the oath, have the seal affixed, and go right back to the post office and have it leave by the first mail. If my wife's signature is also required, this will not delay it because she is with me when I go to the post office, prior to her school, and the bank is less than 200 feet from where I take her.

If you decide to mail the answers and they reach me Friday, Saturday or Monday, don't bother with the return-addressed envelope for I will receive your envelope at home. On Saturday or Monday I will not be able to use the bank notary. Monday is a holiday. Either day I can and will find a different notary and will make immediate return.

Perhaps I should phone you about this, but I just don't have the money.
