

PUERTO RICAN TELLS OF A KENNEDY 'PLOT'

MANILA, April 21 (UPI)—The Philippine National Bureau of Investigation reported today it had arrested a 24-year-old Puerto Rican-born American who, the bureau said, told the authorities he took part in an assassination plot against President Kennedy.

An investigation report shown to newsmen said Luis Angel Castillo had admitted, under the influence of truth serum, that he was in Dallas at the time of the assassination and had been given a rifle by an unidentified man and told to shoot "a man in an open car" during a motorcade.

According to the report, Mr. Castillo said about 15 other plotters were stationed along the motorcade route. He was quoted as saying he was not able to use the rifle because "he heard that somebody else had already shot the man in the open car . . . he tried to remember the man who shot the President and he just knew him as Joc."

The bureau said Mr. Castillo was a Cuban-trained communist agent sent to the Philippines to see Communist Hukbalahap guerrillas. He is being held on a charge of illegally entering the Philippines.

DALLAS, April 21 (UPI) — Law enforcement agents here said today they had never heard of Mr. Castillo.
