

'Not Guilty' Of Assault --Marcello

Carlos Marcello was at liberty under his original bond of \$5,000 today after pleading innocent to a new indictment charging an assault on an agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Marcello was reindicted by a Federal Grand Jury selected in conformity with a recent decision of the U.S. Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals, which held that juries must be chosen in a manner reflecting a broader section of the community.

The alleged attack occurred on the night of Sept. 30, 1966,

at New Orleans International Airport after Marcello arrived from New York, where he was arrested, along with 12 other persons, in the Borough of Queens.

Marcello allegedly struck at Agent Patrick J. Collins Jr., missed, and then threw another punch at him.

Marcello's counsel were given 30 days within which to file technical pleadings, after government attorneys voiced no objection to the delay.
