NEW ORLEANS, June 27-William Gurvich said today that District Attorney Jim Garrison had become so "obsessed" with his inquiry into the assassination of President Kennedy that he has considered raiding the local office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Mr. Gurvich, who quit Mr. Garrison's staff yesterday after serving as a key investigator, also said he would appear before the Orleans Parish grand jury tomorrow to outline "travesties of justice" on Mr. Garrison's part.
