with the House Committee on Un-American Affairs. These negotiations continued until December 7, 1939 and subsequent to this, MAYNE offered WEISBERG what he claimed to be additional original correspondence purporting to bear the signatures of PELLEY and containing references to Congressman DIES. An affidavit listing nine such letters purporting to contain authentic signatures of PELLEY and other documents, including a letter on the letterhead of "The Silvershirt Legion of America", dated at Boston, Massachusetts on July 22, 1938, purporting to bear the signature of PELLEY, was executed by MAYNE before a notary public on January 12, 1940. This affidavit and other documents were delivered to WEISBERG for various sums totaling \$107.

It was determined that these letters were forgeries.
An examination by the FBI Technical Laboratory established the identities of the typewriters used in forging the above mentioned documents. The facts surrounding the violation in this case were presented to the United States Grand Jury for the District of Columbia from April 29 through May 3, 1940. The Grand Jury returned an indictment on May 14, 1940, charging MAYNE with obtaining money under false pretenses on one indictment, and two indictments charging him with forgery. A bench warrant was issued for MAYNE's arrest on May 14, 1940 and he was taken into custody on May 16, 1940 in Washington, D. C. On January 27, 1941, MAYNE entered a plea of guilty to the indictment charging forgery and uttering and one charge of false pretense. On February 12, 1941 MAYNE was sentenced to serve one to three years, which sentence was suspended and he was placed on probation for the same period of time.
