Voorhis' Dissent Says Dies' 'Name Calling' Is 'Undignified'

Californian Defends
Loyal Citizens' Right
To Disagree Politically

Representative Voorhis, Democrat, of California dissented from the majority of the Dies Committee yesterday, accusing it of undignified "name-calling" in its criticism of the Union for Democratic Action.

Representative Voorhis, in a one-man minority report, insisted on "the right of loyal American citizens to disagree politically with a majority of the Dies Committee without being branded as subversive and un-American."

The majority had spoken of a deliberate campaign to undermine Congress in the minds of the people and said the Union for Democratic Action was "composed chiefly of individuals who have been a significant part of the interlocking directorate of the Communist movement in the United States."

Representative Voorhis declared that "there is not one person" connected with the union "where the charge can be substantiated that such person is a Communist."
