Browder Calls Second Front 'Key for Winning War'

NEW YORK, July 3.—In his first public address in nearly two years, Earl Browder, general secretary of the Communist party, declared last night that the American-Soviet-British pacts and the Washington and London agreements to open a second front in Europe and extend all-out aid to China are "the keys to an adequate policy for winning the war."

He addressed an Independence Day rally at Madison Square Garden under the auspices of the New York State Committee of the Communist party.

Mr. Browder said that "Hitler's chief fifth columnists in the United States" are those who have sought to prevent an alliance between Russia and the United States. He named specifically Representative Dies of Texas as one who worked "to the single end of creating every possible obstacle to understanding and agreement between the two great powers whose unity was and is essential to the safety and survival of each."

Mr. Browder referred to his recent 14 months' imprisonment in Atlanta on a passport fraud conviction as "an incidental by-product of the desperate efforts of world reaction, headed by Hitler, to prevent by all means the realization of the United States-Soviet alliance," which he said he had advocated.
