SAN FRANCISCO.—It is unlawful to sing the song "Casey Jones," according to serious contention of the prosecution in the second Bridges trial here.

Chief prosecutor against Bridges entered into evidence against the union official a copy of an old IWW song book.

"I want to call the court's attention to the song entitled 'Casey Jones,'" Prosecutor Del Guercio said, "as proof of the IWW advocacy of sabotage.

"I call your attention especially to the stanza reading:

"Someone put a railroad
tie across the track,

'And Casey hit the river with
an awful whack.'"
