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"AMERICA NEXT" ADVOCATES HONOR SENATOR WHEELER

Last week, Los Angeles Nazis, the America First Committee and their fellow travelers had an opportunity to demonstrate their appreciation of U. S. Senator Burton K. Wheeler.

On Saturday morning, September 27th, the Montanan, arriving from San Francisco, was greeted at the railroad station by a delegation of enthusiastic isolationists, liberally sprinkled with well known Nazi agitators. They carried posters (illustration on page 4) of welcome to "A Great American". However, only a few of these enthusiasts knew that the posters were made by Nazi hands at the Continental Book Store, 2509 West Seventh Street, which is owned and operated by F. K. Ferenz. The signs were painted by his assistant, Dorothy Groton, who testified as Ferenz' character witness when he brought suit against a theatre-owner who refused to let Ferenz continue the showing of Nazi propaganda films.

When photographers took pictures of the welcoming crowd, Ferenz tried to cover his face with a newspaper, but an NRS cameraman succeeded in snapping a number of pictures proving that Nazi Propagandist No. 1 of Los Angeles was on the spot. Ferenz, as always, had his back against the wall, safe from eyes that might have been behind him (illustrations on pages 4 and 8).

On Tuesday, September 30th, Senator Wheeler spoke before the Los Angeles Town Hall, a highly respected organization whose policy is to present speakers on both sides of controversial issues and to permit members to ask questions of the speaker.

Ferenz made his duty appearance. The Senator was asked by a listener whether the reprinting of his speeches for propaganda purposes by Nazi pub-

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lications did not tend to render aid to the enemy. Immediately Ferenz wrote a note to the Senator, "tipping him off" as to the identity of the questioner.

The next day a reception was given in honor of Mr. and Mrs. Wheeler, at the home of Vernard L. Maxam, 4 Berkeley Square (illustration on page 5). The Nazis appeared en masse to shake hands with the guests of honor. Mrs. Wheeler, as active as her husband in isolationism, is very closely identified with "Women United", exposed in NRS #144.

On the Committee of Arrangements for the reception were such people as Mrs. Robert Allen, closely associated with Mrs. Elizabeth Jewett and frequent visitor at the Los Angeles German House; Mrs. J. Henry Orme; Mrs. Frances Sherrill; Mrs. Louise Ward Watkins (all three referred to in previous NRS issues); Mrs. Russell Frederick (Ila Dixon) Buntz, an ardent Nazi follower who recently returned from a trip to South America. Before leaving Los Angeles, she was given letters of introduction by none other than Dr. Georg Gyssling, German Consul General. Mrs. Buntz is organizer and head of the "Humanist Society of Friends", a Nazi organization which emerged into the limelight since Robert Noble has taken a hand in it.

Among the fellow travelers who came to honor the Montana Senator were Mr. and Mrs. G. Allison Phelps, Mr. and Mrs. William S. Hunt, Mrs. Faith McCullough, "Colonel" and Mrs. Bruce Tarkington Dowden, Michael Meller, Mrs. Charles H. Clark, Helen Officer, Fred Dyster, Mr. and Mrs. Leo Pilzer, Dr. C. F. Rosstäuscher, and many others, most of whom were exposed in previous NEWS LETTERS.

He Caters to Haters

On Thursday evening, October 2nd, the Senator delivered a speech as demagogic as his previous Los Angeles utterances, at the Olympic Auditorium. Here he was again hailed as the great American statesman by honest and sincere isolationists as well as by known subversivists. The most thundrous applause was accorded the Montanan when he spoke of Charles A. Lindbergh as "a great and patriotic American" -- this despite the fact that the Lonely Eagle's recent utterances were condemned by national leaders of all creeds and professions, and scored by practically every editorial writer except those who toil for Nazi publications or papers which openly advocate appeasement of Adolf Hitler

The applause was almost as great when Senator Wheeler attacked the American motion picture industry. Completely ignoring the fact that the so-called investigation by his Senatorial Sub-Committee, to determine whether there should be an investigation of alleged warmongering films, was a complete flop, he stated:

Some claim that the silver screen will become known in the future as the modern Benedict Arnold....Today, my friends, a Senate Committee is investigating propaganda in the motion picture industry. Experts and past masters in the art of hocus-pocus have hampered this work. Press agents, publicity experts, exploitation specialists -- hundreds of them throughout the nation and some paid from company funds -- seek to smear the Committee and to explain away poor memories and evasive replies.

They have performed an unconvincing job. Attempts are always made to stop or sabotage Congressional investigations. The present Committee is being attacked by these agents and by those in power as Committees investigating the Tea-Pot Dome and Department of Justice were attacked....Even the Roosevelt administration denounced the present investigation of the motion picture industry. The "investigation" fizzled, but not because it was smeared by press agents, publicity experts, etc. Rather, it was recognized as a subterfuge by Washington correspondents of the nation's press, who reported accordingly to their papers.

That these demagogic statements were cheered by the Wheeler audience is in no way surprising, for there were present many real Benedict Arnolds who often heard the same fallacious arguments at local America First meetings and at gatherings of various subversive organizations.

Among the Senator's Heilers were Hermann Schwinn, West Coast leader of the German-American Bund until his American citizenship was revoked; Hans Diebel, proprietor of the Aryan Book Store, whose application for U. S. citizenship was denied by Federal Court; Muriel Wiseman and Sam Faulk, frequent attendants at the Los Angeles German House; Glenn Belcher, Nellie McCrae, Julia Cane, Larry Griffith, Dr. L. H. Wollendorf, regular attendants at Nazi meetings; Mrs. Faith McCullough, ex-secretary to Nazi propagandist Mrs. Leslie Fry; Martin H. Maeder, head of a secret cell Nazi organization calling itself "The Movement"; Louise Ward Watkins, Apologist No. 1 for Japan's New Order for Asia; Benjamin Franklin Ballard, chairman of the Los Angeles Downtown Chapter of America First and co-organizer of the "American Guards", a Nazi oranization; Arthur Burnett, alias Roy Chase, organizer of the picket line at the Wendell Willkie Hollywood Bowl meeting; Charles Cobb, chairman of the Pasadena Chapter of America First, whose rantings against the Washington administration were such that the school board withdrew the use of the hall until Cobb promised to "tone down".

Dr. Rosstäuscher, frequently seen at subversive meetings, was also there, as were Mr. and Mrs. Leo Pilzer, members of the Bund and the German-American Alliance; W. H. Sahli, influential leader of the Ku Klux Klan; Mrs. Van Meter, her daughter and four sons, members of the Bund; D. H. Rathbone, printer of Nazi literature; Chester B. Anderson, former Ku Klux Klan leader and organizer of the Royal Order of American Defenders; Robert Noble, former Ham-and-Egg leader, now associated with the Humanist Society of Friends; Helen Officer and Sarah Morrison, anti-Semitic agitators; Ellis C. Jones, organizer of the National Copperheads, and habitue of the Los Angeles German House; G. Allison Phelps, exposed in NRS #161; ex-Congressman John Harry Hoeppel, editor of the pro-appeasement newspaper, "National Defense", who was found guilty and jailed by a Federal Court for selling appointments to Annapolis.

In the audience also were Dowden, Ferenz' associate; Gertrude Wouters and Ray Bechtelheimer, Bund hangers-on; Mr. and Mrs. P. P. Lewis and their son Carrington, regular attendants at T. W. Hughes' meetings. Ferenz, Nazi film exhibitor, was among them with Dorothy Groton, according to the NRS camera reporter (illustration on page 4). Ferenz constantly hung around the Senator wherever he appeared during his stay in Los Angeles.

Bund Stormtrooperette Goes Into Action

Many well known Nazis acted as ushers, including Joan McBride, who had come with her husband James. The swastika-braceletted Mrs. McBride frequently acts as waitress at the German House. In true stormtrooper fashion, she was ready to assail a woman who heckled Senator Wheeler when he made his ridiculous charges against the American film industry (illustration on page 1).

At the auditorium entrance, Noble distributed literature; Jones sold the Nazi smear sheet, "Publicity" (illustration on page 4), and reprints of Lindbergh's Des Moines speech, gotten out by his Copperheads. Mrs. Charles H. Clark, also mentioned earlier, distributed handbills (illustration on page 5)

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

Prelude to Patrioteering

Passing the collection box at the Wheeler rally -- a necessary item on the agenda of each America First meeting -- was under the direction of Marshall Perham, who delivered a purse-loosening appeal to the assemblage.

Perham has appeared before America First audiences on many occasions. He specializes in anti-British harangues, following Committee policies to a T. Occasionally, his mind erupts with an idea to heighten America First attacks against the Administration's policies, and against war efforts by the Allies. Recently, he sent to national headquarters of America First a gruesome photograph of a skull flanked by three-dots-and-a-dash and two "V"s (illustration on this page), with the suggestion that it be reproduced and circulated throughout the country to offset the current campaign for Britain's victory.

Presiding at the Wheeler rally was Joseph Scott, prominent Los Angeles lawyer and Catholic layman. Two days before the meeting, Scott was the in-

tended victim of a "putsch" on the part of a handful of "America Next" Nazis. They marched to the office of John Wheeler, son of the Senator and head of the local America First organization, to demand Scott's ouster as chairman of the Wheeler meeting. They were opposed to Scott because he had publicly denounced Lindbergh, following the Lonely Eagle's disastrous denouement in Des Moines. Scott had issued a statement to the press, saying:

It is very unfortunate that Colonel Lindbergh raised the issue in the manner in which he did.... They (Jews) are a patriotic, socially-minded group. They have a right to be disturbed, especially at the abominable treatment of their race by Hitler. But I don't think they want to drag this country into war.

Signs of the Times

This incident was but part of a busy afternoon's activities by these "patriots". Two hours before the foregoing call, they had picketed the offices of Dr. Beauchamp, a leading dentist. The reason for this picketing becomes apparent from the signs which were carried (illustration on page 5). One read: "Warmongers! Don't patronize Dr. Beauchamp. He advertises in Manchester Boddy's Los Angeles Daily News". Another proclaimed: "We speak for the 83% who are against war. Do no business with advertisers in warmongering newspapers." Still another denounced the Daily News and all war newspapers, and praised Lindbergh. The picketers had hoped to attack the Los Angeles Daily News through one of its advertisers. The Daily News has steadfastly endorsed administration policies. Hence, it was no surprise to find, among the picketers, Daniel Van Meter, Joan McBride, Arthur Burnett (alias Roy Chase), F. K. Ferenz, Ellis O. Jones, Robert Noble -- all of them mentioned before.

The picketing was under the direction of Noble who, three days earlier, had distributed handbills (illustration on page 4) at an Embassy Auditorium meeting under his own sponsorship. Noble caters to the same group of downand-outers, Nazis and haters that flock to hear the rantings of T. W. Hughes.

Dr. Beauchamp inserted in the Daily News a subtle analysis of this unexpected parade in front of his offices. In a paid advertisement, he remarked, among other things, that this was indeed a strange place to agitate about foreign affairs, and concluded: "If you want a good interventionist bridge, or an isolationist jacket crown, we advise you to go elsewhere....But if you are in the market for some first class dental work, we can give you this service".

Matters are really approaching a state of confusion:

- 1. Senator Wheeler, through creation of the Senatorial Committee to investigate whether there should be an investigation of the American film industry, is trying to curtail constitutional freedom of expression.
- 2. Senator Wheeler, in all his speeches, accuses President Roosevelt of being a dictator, and cries that his (Wheeler's) freedom of speech has been curtailed.
- 3. America Next Nazis demand the ouster of an America First official who dared criticize Lindbergh.
- 4. America Next Nazis picket the office of a dentist because he advertises in a paper which doesn't like Hitler.

All of them demand for themselves the American Constitutional right of free expression, and use that very same right in an attempt to silence those who stand behind the President's foreign policy.

Senator Wheeler plays politics with our country's safety -- at the same time, he plays into the hands of the Fifth Column. The Knights of the Trojan Horse appreciate the Senator, for he supplies them with new grist for their mills of subversivism.
