applause, and where speakers unhesitatingly advocate that the USA emulate Hitler's example.

Fred Chase, executive secretary of the America First Committee, telephoned from Washington, instructing headquarters to put phone squads into action immediately to drum up more letters and telegrams to Congressmen, urging defeat of the Neutrality Act revision. Through those who are as much at home at the America First office as at the German House, word was spread quickly in all subversive circles, which swung into Blitz-tempo action, hustling up messages to the Washington solons. Many were signed with fictitious names. Some were worded in a threatening manner, advising Washington representatives to expect defeat when they seek re-election.

This routine is by no means new. It follows an old Nazi pattern. In NRS #88, a typical Nazi high-pressure letter was reproduced, addressed to Congressman Frank E. Hook of Michigan by the German-American National Alliance. The writer, Paul A. F. Warnholtz, did not urge -- he threatened most impudently that his organization would go after the Representative's political scalp if he dared vote in favor of Neutrality Legislation, then pending. The letter was dated October 3, 1939 -- one month after the outbreak of war, when Americans had not yet found their bearings in the new world situation, whereas the Nazis

Lord Lothian's Death Caused By Heartbreak

BRITISH AMBASSADOR'S SOUL WAS TORN BY DEEP SYMPATHIES FOR REICH

Journalist Finds That Diplomat Was Engaged in a Conflict Be-tween Conviction and Duty That Had Him Fighting a War He Inherently Believed Wrong—Lothian Was of Cliveden Set of Non-Interventionists in Europe's Struggle with Hitler—Favored Paying War Debts, Giving Danzig to Hitler-Hitler.

His death is universally achnowledged to be one of the greatest tragedies of the war. Capital insiders advise that one may dismiss the possibility of death due to unnatural cause. The fantastic report that the death due to unsatural cause. The fantastic report that the British Ambassador was poisoned by an Axis agent is not accorded credence.

TWO REASONS

TWO REASONS Boiled down, the insiders here ascribe two fundamental rea-sons for the distinguished Ambassadors untimely death at his post of duty. No physician was summoned in time to try to cure the Ambassador of uremic poisoning. By his own request, true to the tenets of his adopted American religion, Lord Lothian pre-ferred the attendance of a bachelor of Christian Science. But behind the physical factor was an inherent conflict in Lord Lothian's noble soul—a veritable conflict between conviction and duty, the like of which Washington rarely sees. After all, no physician could cure the Ambassador of his major malady—fighting a war in which he could not inherently believe.

"It takes a truly noble soul to experience a real soul struggle," was the way one high official tersely expressed his passing. LUNDEEN'S SPEECHES RECALLED

in this country were already well prepared for action. Warnholtz' threat is such a typical example of Nazi audacity that NRS reproduces it again on page 5.

Handbills bearing the imprint of the America First Committee were distributed by followers of the "Friends of Progress", the organization headed by Robert Noble, exposed in last week's NEWS LETTER. At the meeting of this organization held on Saturday, November 8th, Captain James D'Orsay Murray, a speaker for the America First Committee, was the main attraction. His audience cheered when he gave the Nazi outstretched arm salute and described the customary handshake greeting as a sign of weakness. He praised Benito Mussolini and Adolf Hitler, and referred to Winston Churchill as a drunkard who would be lynched by the people of France if they could get their hands on him. He called President Roosevelt a forger, charging that the secret Nazi map showing Germany's intention with regard to South America was a fake. He offered old and worn-out Nazi propaganda stories such as the claim that the Athenia was sunk by the British. He planted the seed of defeatism by claiming that Germany has already won the war and America is merely prolonging the agony. Noble, chairman of the meeting, went even further in his praise of Hitler's New Order and condemnation of the President. He charged that President Roosevelt was responsible for the murder of Huey Long.


He's "Telling the World"

At this meeting, Larry Griffith, long known for his activities in subversive groups,

distributed leaflets (illustration on page 5), urging people to join his newly organized "United Minute Men and Women of America". Griffith's printer is D. H. Rathbone, a pamphleteer of sorts in his own name. Rathbone's most recent contribution to the "literary" field was distributed at the Armistice night meeting of the "Christian American Guards", held, like Noble's gatherings, at the Embassy Auditorium. The sort of material Rathbone prints is reflected in the opening paragraph of his latest brainchild:

I'M TELLING THE WORLD! That Franklin D. Roosevelt, President of the USA, is either an idiot - insane - or a willful and malicious traitor to these United States of America, and to all honest beings everywhere. And anyone who does not KNOW this to be TRUE is a stupid boob - not fit to live in a civilized, democratic nation. And if the Congress and Senate do not impeach him, they are either boobs - cowards - or traitors to the nation - themselves!! And I challenge any man or woman on earth to disprove these SELF-EVIDENT FACTS!

On Sunday, November 9th, two meetings attracted subversivists. One, called by the Ku Klux Klan, was held in the afternoon at 845 South Figueroa Street; the other was the regular meeting of T. W. Hughes! "League to Save America First", held at the Embassy Auditorium. At both meetings, the America First circular was distributed. Attendants at the gathering of the Klan were told that the Knights of the Midnight Mystery will take an active part in the forthcoming Congressional election. Their intention to enter politics was also revealed in a letter (illustration on page 6) sent to Klansmen by James M. Harvey, newly appointed organizer of the Knights of the night-shirts.



On Armistice night, the "Christian American Guards" made their debut under the chairmanship of W. H. Sahli, Harvey's assistant. Speakers were Dr. Albert W. Carlson, Dr. Richard F. Carlyle and James D'Orsay Murray. Baron and William Van Meter, Bundits, and Frank King, Robert Noble's righthand man, acted as guards, so identified by blue "C. A. Guards" armbands.

C.A.G. buttons of the organization (illustration on this page) were sold, and an ambitious program of the group was unfolded to a packed house.

Father Coughlin's "Social Justice" and the Nazi smear sheet "Fublicity" were on sale. The America First leaflet again appeared among the printed mating of Robert Noble (illustration on page 4), and a circular issued by William Kullgren, publisher of the "Beacon Light", advertising the Flanders Hall book, "Lord Lothian vs. Lord Lothian" (illustration on page 2). This circular quotes a dispatch sent to The New York Enquirer by Prescott Dennett, the man who figured in the news recently when it was revealed that his "Islands for Debts Committee" and "Make Europe Pay War Debts Committee" were financed by Nazi Agent George Sylvester Viereck. Dennett's organizations mailed thousands of pieces of propaganda literature under the franchises of isolationist senators and conin the District of Columbia.

On Thursday afternoon, November 13th, the America First Women's Group held a meeting at the Kipling Hotel, Los Angeles. A late arrival who had seen the newspaper headlines, reported that the Neutrality Bill revision had passed; whereupon the speaker, Patrick C. Calhoun, an honest isolationist and loyal American, stated that Americans must back up the President now. His

We believe that his constituents may want to know.

Yes, we are Americans of German descent and deem ourselves as loyal and patriotic as any other Americans. It is also true that we do not care to have the mothers of our sons become "Gold Star Mothers", for a cause alien to the interest of our country. We do not want our sons to become converted by bullets into stinkin; masses of flesh. These words are realistic, but they are prompted by our feelings on the matter of keeping America out of war. Yes, we shall also give full publicity to the vote of every senator and congressman on this question, so that the record may speak for itself. - We also know that such action will be resented by a few. But why? What is wrong about a truthful record ?

the success of the first meet ing. The money collected at the Guards gathering was counted at the German House, and the silver was exchanged for paper money across the bar at the Nazi headquarters.

After receiving the report, Schwinn and Diebel cautioned those fronting for them that the "Guards" must exercise care in the beginning, and advocate nothing which will arouse public ill will. "The organization is still too small and weak and can easily be destroyed," said the erstwhile Bund leader, and advised: "Get strong first and then show your real colors." "Emphasize that your organization wants to guard the Constitution and the Bill of Rights and protect America and Christianity," Diebel counselled.

Schwinn was told that the audience wants action; soft pedalling of what they consider "real issues" would make the meetings too dull to attract larger audiences. The little Führer replied, "The real points can be gotten across to the public so that they will be satisfied without laying the leadership open to charges of subversivism."

The second public meeting of the Christian American Guards was held yesterday (November 18th) with Louise

Ward Watkins as the principal speaker. Marvin Wilson, who also shared the platform, was exposed in NRS #119, when he tried to take over the local Willkie Club, pretending that he was sent here by the New York headquarters of The usual hater-baiters were again in attendance. that group. Those who enjoy the complete confidence of the Trojan Horsemen were told that there is a secret board of strategy behind the Christian American Guards, now striving to create a United Front of all the big and little pro-Nazi organizations and isolationist groups.

NRS correspondents report that in their cities, too, the America First Committee has taken the lead in the high pressure campaign against the revision of the Neutrality Act. In New York, the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League wrote to members of the House of Representatives:

Typical America First Committee letter drumming up pressure mail to Congressmen to defeat Neutrality Bill revision.

This evidence conclusively proves the existence of a highly financed and well-organized campaign machine. operating throughout the country. to evoke an unnatural flood of letters on this subject, which do not in any way reflect the spontaneous wishes of the majority of the people.

I know that members of Congress will not be influenced by such bought-and-paidfor "letters from Constituents", but feel that you might nevertheless desire to have this evidence on your desk. The League suggests, moreover, the propriety of some kind of appropriate Congressional investigation of the lobby which is operating to produce these letters.
