2. - Organization of Agency, Continued

(1) - Who is the person responsible for the handling of industrial cases?

Manager - in his absence, assistant manager.

(2) - To what office or offices dies each office make reports on industrial cases? These reports may be in the form of manager's weekly letters or otherwise.

If an inter-office case, to the operating office. If not, merely to their accounting headquarters.

(3) - To what office or offices does each office make accounting reports on industrial cases?

All offices make accounting reports to New York Office, with the exception of San Francisco, Los Angeles, Seattle, Portland and Spokane, who make accounting reports to San Francisco Office.

(4) - How are industrial cases assigned to each office?

Are such cases assigned only from New York in every case,
or from one field office to another? Does one field
office have jurisdiction over other field offices
with respect to the assignment or handling of industrial
cases? If so, which are the divisional offices, and
which branch offices are included in each division?

Each office handles their own cases. No jurisdiction.

(5) - Are non-industrial cases handled differently with respect to questions (1), (2), (3), or (4), and if so, in what way?

Do not understand the question. All industrial cases are handled the same as other cases.
