

Arlington Publisher Posts Bond in Sedition Case

James C. True of Arlington, one of 30 persons indicted here on a charge of conspiring to undermine the morale of the armed forces, posted \$5,000 bond late today in the criminal clerk's office in District Court.

The bond was underwritten by Margaret E. O'Connor, a professional bondswoman. True gave his address as 1803 N. Quinn street, Arlington. The Justice Department says True is publisher of Industrial Control Reports and is organizer of the James True Associates.

OMAHA, July 24 (AP).—Charles B. Hudson, indicted by a Federal grand jury in Washington on charges of criminal sedition and conspiracy, surrendered today.

He was released on \$5,000 bond and told to be ready to appear in Washington for hearing.

ST. LOUIS, July 24 (AP).—Prescott Freese Dennett, a private at Jefferson Barracks, was ordered removed to Washington today for arraignment and trial on an indictment charging conspiracy to break down the morale of the armed forces.

Dennett formerly was secretary of the "Make Europe Pay War Debts Committee," which later became the "Islands for War Debts Committee" and still later the "War Debts Committee."

Dennett, 33, was inducted June 20 and transferred here July 11. He was taken into custody by military police Wednesday night and turned over to the United States marshal yesterday.
