waste for another 3 weeks. We are  
scheduled to finish our "basic" 3 weeks  
from this past Saturday. One of the  
parts of the course they are dropping  
so we can do it by then in the "judo"  
training - a kind of fire judo that I  
think would be very helpful to us.

This week has developed into a lengthy  
one while the corporal is figuring out how the  
thing on the rifle works. I figured out yester-  
day that I could easily get a shooting medal if  
my right eye was 10% better. The course  
looks very easy, but can't see 200%  
what that came out.
