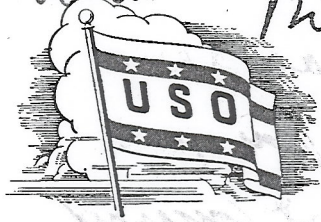


When - There are several 6/1/43

sorted, & there is nothing from you.

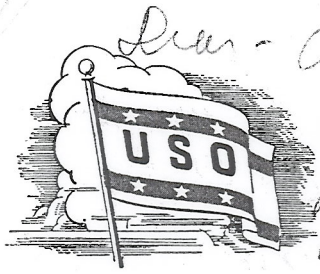
Which has me just a bit concerned.

Dear - I am well 6/1/43

were that this is the first of  
the treatment days. I  
wish I could tell you  
something. The shipment to  
Tacnton is off, having left this m.  
There is no news as yet regarding  
the next shipment or any other.

At the moment, the most opto-  
mistic thinking suggests the only  
chance of our doing it this period  
is if I don't sleep & you come up  
here. But will I know in time  
to let you know in time for you to  
get here whether or not you'll  
shipping? I don't think so.

So let us not plan but  
just continue to hope - to hope  
that I get shipped before the  
period is over & that I can get  
home at least once during that  
time.



About half of the regiment has  
shipped. It is possible for me to  
stay a while. As far as I know  
there will be no shipments to-  
morrow, but letters can come in  
unexpectedly....

Several of the boys from my  
new company who shipped out  
last week have come back on  
parole and they appear to be  
satisfied.

A curious thing happened at  
break today (at almost 1 noon).  
For the first time since we have  
up here there was a man. His  
infection at the mess hall!

Because so many of the  
men are getting sick, the cook ex-  
plained. But 75% of a man has  
shipped!

For now, dear Maudie, all. Still  
have had no letter from you today. If there  
is other news I'll write again. Love <sup>the boys</sup>
