it was no fun.


And once again I begin to wonder.

I went to the P.O. & got your letter of Friday. Good to get it even if it's duplicated in phone call.


In some parts of Alaska you will be home less this summer. I hope the room is Division 1 gas for air possible.

trunk & forgot again.


I believe I told you New
