

DETAILS:

The Honorable LEON H. A. PIERSON, United States Attorney, Baltimore, Maryland, advised by letter dated June 8, 1958, that HAROLD and LILLIAN WEISBERG have made a claim against the government for \$9,950.00 for damages allegedly sustained by them in their poultry business as a result of a disturbance caused by low-flying helicopters. Mr. PIERSON requested that

The following information was obtained by a review of the files of the United States Attorney's Office on June 18, 1959:

On November 19, 1958, HAROLD WEISBERG and LILL WEISBERG filed a complaint in U. S. District Court, District

claims Act through their attorneys, JESSE H. CHESSIN, JOSEPH L. RAUH, JR., and JOHN SILARD, 705-09 Knickerbocker Building, Baltimore, Maryland.

Plaintiffs are joint owners of a 14 acre tract of land in Hyattstown, Maryland, on Route 109 between U.S. 240 and Maryland Route 355, upon which is their place of residence and upon which they operate the Coq d'or Farm, a business jointly owned by the plaintiffs. The principal business and source of revenue of the Coq d'or Farm is the raising of pheasant-chickens, Rock Cornish game hens, waterfowl and other poultry and the sale of poultry and their eggs.

This business, according to the complaint, requires the maintenance of a careful and controlled environment free from loud and disturbing noises which may produce shockinducing unanticipated and undesirable "moulting" and may reduce the egg-laying productivity of the poultry. The complaint alleges that on July 12, 1957, and on a considerable and continuing number of occasions in 1957 and 1958 a number of helicopters have flown directly over the plaintiffs' property and farm. These helicopters were allegedly owned by the United and control of Headquarters, Military District of Washington, U.S. Army. These flights were allegedly at various heights of less than 300, 200 and 100 feet.

According to the plaintiffs, these flights have caused them to suffer serious impairment in their poultry business in that the sudden and excessively severe noise accompanying the helicopter flights at low altitudes has induced unanticipated and undesirable "moulting" and various other injuries in the poultry and egg production of the Coq d'or Farm.

Plaintiffs ask that they be awarded a judgment against the United States of America in the sum of \$9,950.00 representing damages.

Mr. LEON H. A. PIERSON, United States Attorney, Baltimore, Maryland, advised on June 23, 1959, he desired fellowing information from

- 1. Details of the operation of the Coq d'or Far
- Did he ever see helicopters over this farm?
- 3. What were the real losses from the helicopters?
- Are losses exaggerated?
- 5. Were there any losses from poultry diseases or other natural causes?
 - Names and addresses of any other employees of the Coq d'or Farm.
- 7. Dates of semployment at Coq d'or Farm and his wages.

Mr. PIERSON said he obtained the name of and his address from the Department of the Army, Washington, 25, D. C., in a letter from Colonel E. W. SARGENT, JAGC, Chief of Litigation Division. This letter bears the initials of the person dictating it as JAGL and file number as The letter is captioned "Re: HAROLD AND LILLIAN WEISBERG v. UNITED STATES, Civil Action #11036." Mr. PIERSON said that in the event cannot be located at the address furnished, the Department of the Army may be able to advise the source of this address.

Mr. PIERSON requested that the interview with be conducted promptly inasmuch as the results of this interview are needed before he can proceed with the preparation of this case for trial.
