This was several years ago and he related that one time when he was in the hen house the hens jumped up as though something scared them, at which time he looked out of the hen house and saw a helicopter a child walking into the hen house and he lost no chickens no more than a result.

Said that her husband has lost no chickens as chickens as a result of helicopters and she knows of no loss of egg production as a result of helicopters flying over the farm. She said disturbances can cause laying hens to stop laying and also cause blood spots in eggs.

He said he knows helicopter flights also cause a loss in egg production of Mr. WEISBERG's hens. He was unable to say how many chickens Mr. WEISBERG lost as a result of the helicopter flights, or his losses in egg production.
