Ladd EMPLOYEES DISMISSED BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT Reference is made to the attached memorandum from Mr. Negse to you dated July 21, 1947, which advised that the Attorney General's Office inquired as to whether we had furnished a memorandum to the State Department on the background of certain individuals dismissed by the State Department as follows: Harold weisberg, and General has indicated that in the event the Bureau had furnished the State Department with anything concerning these people that he would like to see it and if we had not furnished background information concerning them to the State Department, he would like to have whatever information we have in our files concerning them.

With respect to Weisberg, it is known that investigation in the Gregory case has reflected that he was a fellow employes of The Bureau's files fail to reflect that any information on Harold Weisberg has been furnished to the State Department.

Pursuant to the Attorney General's request, a review is being made of the Bureau's files for all information on and Harold Weisberg. This information and summaries on and which were sent to the State Department, will be made available to the Attorney General.

For your additional information, Mr. Caudle of the Criminal Division and Mr. Douglas W. McGregor of the Department, by letters dated July 9, 1947, and July 17, 1947, respectively, have requested summaries on a total of eleven individuals, including those mentioned above, who were dismissed by the State Department under the McCarran Rider and these will be furnished to the Department in the immediate future.
