

Weisberg received information placing blame on the FBI from a high official in the United States Secret Service. The identity of the official was not known.

We are well acquainted with Weisberg in view of his previously written criticisms in connection with the handling of the Kennedy assasination by the Warren Commission, FBI, Secret Service, etc. His writings in the past have contained discrepancies, falsehoods, and deliberate slanting of the facts. During the past several months he has made numerous requests of the Department under the Freedom of Information Act for data relating to the assasination apparently in connection with compiling information for his new book.
