D. J. S.

(1) Francis Adams, former New York City Police Commissioner, will serve as an Assistant to Mr. Rankin. Adams was selected by Rankin and Warren.

(2) Another Assistant to Rankin will be Albert E. Jenner, Jr., a trial lawyer from Chicago, who is connected with the "Satterlee" law firm.

(3) The Commission has been very much impressed with an article which appeared in the current issue of New Republic entitled "Seeds of Doubt." The article deals with the assassination of President Kennedy and has been tabled by the Commission for some future discussion. (see copy of 12/17/63 memo, attached)

(4) Mrs. Juli Eide has been appointed to serve as a secretary to the Commission.
