Some time ago I think it is you who gave me copies of some of Bud's N.O. files, which I put aside to go over when I could. As I awaited an overdue guest today I started and I've gone over the Garrison Bartes file. It is incompetent and inadequate, but there are several things of minor interest in it that can become major in considering Oswald.

It shows the FBI could have done much better on the rental of the space at 544 for several reasons: the record existed and were in possession of the man that Wall allegedly interviewed; and this man was in regular touch with the FBI, not at all indicted by on-the-Ball-Wall. Therefore, they had some motive to hide this. And the renting group was after or coincided with CRC, I'm inclined to think the latter. But Newman's comment that some still used the space in his undated letter is interesting.

Should you ever see any other reference to the lawyer Belier, first par. Martin's 7/29/67 memo, it would interest me much. The law firm is in the same bldg as Marques-Diaz, I think the Baronne Bldg. It has been a long time...But I have a tip from an undependable source on this firm.
