This is to obtain approval for Al Varren C. de Brusys, recently transferred from New Orleans to the Civil Rights Section, to return to New Orleans on \$/36/67 on annuel losve in order to complete the transportation of his household effects and his family to Vashington, D. C., and handle other personal and logal matters possibling from his transfer.

Although nows media have indicated District Attorney Jim Garrison of New Orleans has had a subpoens in connection with his investigation of the assummation of Promident Mennedy issued in SA descript' mano, which subpoens could be served while SA de Brusys is in the New Orleans Carea, the U.S. Attorney at New Orleans has already indicated that Garrison could legally subpoess do Brusys enteride of Louisians.

In view of this, it appears that SA do Brusys should proceed with his plans, and if he is served with a subposes, the U. S. Atterney, New Orleans, and the Department will he immediately advised and consulted for a determination as to action to be taken thereon.

By way of background, prior to the assessination of Promident Remody, 84 de Brueys handled investigations portaining to security matters, including cases involving anti-Castro subjects and organizations, as well as the case involving the Fairplay for Cube Coumittee. On the day subsequent to Promident Remody's assessination, 84 de Brueys reported for special assignment at Ballas, Texas, in connection with the investigation of that matter, where he remained for approximately two mouths before returning to New Orleans. 84 de Brueys was

ensigned to the Nov Orleans Division from 1961 until 2/1/07, the date of his departure from Now Orleans on transfer to the Seat of Government.

In connection with the assessmention investigation and has appeared before the Orleans Parish Ornad Jury on 5/17/67 and invoked privilege in not responding to certain questions directed to him on the authority of the Attorney General of the United States. Assistant U. S. Attorney John C. Ciolino, New Orleans, advised subsequent to SA Beamedy's appearance that the District Attorney's Office had indicated that SA Beamedy was officially excused.

A subposen has been issued by District Attorney
Garrison and an attempt was made to serve this subposen en
Special Agent de Brueys at the New Orleans Office. Because of
Departmental interest in the Garrison investigation and because
Special Agent de Brueys would be required to invoke Departmental
order 324-64 (Confidential Character of Bureau Files and
Information), it would be a further test of that order, it is
believed advisable to put the Department on motice in writing
of Special Agent de Brueys' intention to visit New Orleans,
prior to his departure.

Garrison's decoding procedure as set forth by news media was examined in the Cryptanalysis-Translation Section. That Section reports that it would appear to involve a complex manipulation of two letters and five digits, which Garrison misinterprets as "PO 19106" and thereafter arbitrarily changes by adding telephone dial equivalents for "P" and "O", or 7 6 equals 13, then arbitrarily splits this 13 into two segments of 9 and 4 which he re-equates on the telephone dial to "WH." In a similarly arbitrary fashion, Garrison changes 19106 by rearrangement into 16901 and then subtracts 1300 from this rearranged number to obtain 15601. Combining the two manipulations, he comes up with "WH 1-5601" which was Jack Ruby's telephone number. Garrison's purported decipherment is an arbitrary manipulation of letters and numbers to arrive at a predetermined conclusion and no technical validation for it can be found.

We are in receipt of an allegation that District Attorney James C. Gerrison may have committed a freud against the Government and we must now decide how this allegation will be furnished to the Department and whether the Bureau should initiate a Fraud investigation.

By sirtel 5-5-67 the New Orleans Office forwarded information received from each

Kohn, managing director of the Netropolitan Crime Commission in New Orleans. Generally, the information relates to some of the legal excesses of the Gerrison investigation. Specifically, Kohn is alleged to have advised that he Tearned that District Attorney Gerrison had been offered the epportunity of resigning his commission with the Mational Guard or facing military charges. Kehn advised that Gerrison is alleged to have falsified his drill duty certifications for approximately six months for which he was paid. Mr. Kohn advised that Gerrison might be in violation of Federal statutes for this alleged fraud.

In March, 1967, Raymond Buff, district director of the U.S. Oustons Service in New Orleans, advised that he received information that Carrison had been permitted to resign his commission in the Mational Guard as of the last week in February, 1967. Buff stated that it was his understanding that Carrison, who held the rank of lieutenant colonel, was falsifying his attendance records and claimed to be at "drill" when, in fact, he was not. Buff added that he did not know if this could be confirmed.

As reflected in memorandum 4-12-67, this information was supplied to Assistant Attorney General Vinson of the Criminal Division and Assistant Attorney General Teagley of the Internal

the possible fraud violation and without comment as to any action contemplated by the Bureau. At the same time, it was pointed out that any investigation of Garrison by us could well result in criticism of the Bureau and could be construed by Garrison and his associates as an attempt by the Bureau to impede Garrison's investigation of the assassimation of President Kennedy.

OBSERVATIONS:

We have now received from two sources the same basic allegation of fraud in connection with Garrison's service in the Louisians Mational Guard. The situation today is the same as existed in April, 1967. Any investigation of the fraud allegation by the Bureau would become known in the New Orleans area. Rightly or wrongly, the Bureau would be accured of trying to intimidate Garrison and engaging in the same tactics which are currently being charged to Garrison himself.

ACTION:

Tt is believed the Bureau's best course of action here would be to disseminate to Assistant Attorneys General Sanders, Vinson and Yeagley the information we have received since these individuals are the normal recipients of all data volunteered to the Bureau concerning the current Garrison investigation. It would not be in the Bureau's best interest to voluntarily institute a fraud investigation of Garrison at this time. Therefore, the data will be disseminated to the Department without highlighting the possible fraud violation and without comment as to action contemplated by the Bureau.

Bob, Bill Branigan said that your letter to the AG should contain a paragraph along the lines "We have been advised by Mr. Nathaniel E. Kossack, Criminal Division of the Department, that the United States Attorney in New Orleans will attempt to quash the subpoenas on 5/8/67. If he is not successful, it is assumed that he will appear in court on 5/10/67 with our Special Agent."

For your information, the information concerning Departmental Order 324-64 is located in the Manual of Rules and Regulations, Section 8, Part II, page 10 and 11.

For your further information -

Nathaniel E. Kossack, First Assistant, Criminal Division of the Department, contacted Rex Schroder in Division Six, 5/5/67 and told him that the U.S. Attorney in New Orleans had called and advised concerning the subpoena of the Agents and that he had instructed the U.S. Attorney to go into court the first thing Monday morning (5/8/67) and try to get the subpoenas quashed. He did not indicate to Schroder (or at least it wasn't conveyed to me) what will occur if the U.S. Attorney fails to get the subpoena quashed. I assume this is the reason for the above paragraph being in the letter.

Joe A. Sizoo will be in tomorrow (5/6/67) to sign the memo and letter to the AG out. You might touch base with him about the contents of the letter. He said he will be in about 10:30 AM.

Assassination of president kennedy

Mr. Gry Hettel, former SAC, Washington Field Office, now econocted with the Hersemen's Benevalent and Pretective Association, advised that he had been contacted by one Herb Rasovich (phonetic), an acquaintance in New Orleans, Louisiana. He was advised that William Wegmann, a former District Atterney in New Orleans and new connected with a rather large law firm in New Orleans, is representing Clay L. Shaw in connection with the "Riasoo" of District Atterney Garrison in New Orleans relative to the assassination.

Hettel indicated that Wegmann desired to come to Washington and discuss this situation with the Director. Hettel advised that he had no interest in this matter whatsoever and was merely passing it on for the information of the Bureau. He stated that he suggested Wegmann he advised to contact the Agent in Charge of our New Orleans Office and ! Wegmann declined to do so without giving any reason he indicated that he would in the absence of not seeing the Director like to talk to an Assistant Director of the Bureau in Washington. Hettel inquired as to whether or not this would be permissible.

Hottel was advised that in the event Wegmann came to Washington and had any information whatsoever to volunteer relative to the assassination of President Kennedy the Bureau would be glad to accept it. He was told, however, that in the event information related directly to Carrison's investigation in New Orleans the Bureau would not be able to offer Wegmann any assistance of any kind.
