I am sending you my entire "Right to Privacy vs. Right to Know" file which includes clips on the Army Intelligence trial, also names of ACLU attorneys.

I don't know if I'm doing you a favor sending my file. There's a lot in it you may not be interested in but will, I'm sure, feel compelled to read.

Are you aware of Project King Alfred? Supposed to have been prepared by Dept. of Defense according to Dick Gregory who showed me a copy. It well could have been Army Intelligence. It ~~is a blueprint for~~ is a plan for putting down insurrection. It puts Hitler to shame, really. It actually is a blueprint for extermination of all blacks in America, referring to them as "excess units of production." The timetable portion of the document has an eight-hour count-down leading to sealing off all areas of resistance with troops, tanks. Gregory also said DOD has a device for identifying light-skinned Negroes, an ultra-violet light which reacts to negroid pigmentation.

My initial reaction was shock and disbelief. Later, I rationalized that its purpose was



to scare the hell out of militants and "leaking" it to them would do the job. Now, however, (after the Army Intelligence expose) I don't know what to think.

A few weeks ago, I wrote Dick asking him to release the report, to me if he wished. Walter Glanze received a carbon. I haven't heard from Dick yet (I think he's in Mexico). Walter is aware of contents of Project King Alfred, may even have a copy. I felt that if it tied in to Army Intelligence activities, the climate was ripe for public disclosure.
