1. As requested by the Commanding General this memorandum for the record states the activities which took place on riday ev ning, 23 hovember 1903.

- 2. At approximately 1700 hours I boarded an H-21 helicopter at Fort Hyer with an eight man Army Casket Team. Upon landing at Andrews Air Force Tase, Maryland, at approximately 1730 hours, I reported to aptain Patton, special events officer, Military Listrict of Washington, while Sgt Felder, BLEC, marched the team to an area just outside the Air Force Cordon.
- 3. Captain Patton instructed no to be prepared to take three courses of action. First, that the all Army Casket Team would remove the remains from the Presidential Aircraft. Second, that a joint are ad forces eashed team would be formed if personnel from the other services arrived prior to the arrival of the aircraft. Third, that the Presidential Aircraft had relieve that Secret Service Agents aboard the aircraft would remove the Presidents casket.

- h. The second plan was placed in action as representives from each service arrived prior to the aircraft's landing. I formed two'?) joint service teams. One would accompany me on a lee lift truck and secure the remains from the aircraft and place it on the truck. The hed would then be lowered and the second team would remove the remains from the truck and place it either in an ambulance or helicopter.
- 5. Immediately after the aircraft landed and the truck was moved up to the aircraft, I reported to brigadier General McHugh, President Remedy's Air Force Aide. He then ordered me to have by non-clear the area and also informed me that the Secret Service would remove the easiest from the aircraft. If then instructed by son to decend from the truck by a ladder on the side. Seeing that the casket was being poorly handled, I had two(2) men remain in place on the truck. We assisted General clugh and the agents until they had the casket out of the aircraft.
- 6. The casket was made of solid bronze and was extremely heavy. Irs. Homedy, Fr. Robert Hennedy, and their party moved onto the bed of the truck which then decended to the bottom level.
- 7. The second cashet team was at the left side of the truck and as it moved forward to secure the cashet was disrupted by a heat of agents moving forward pushing the team out of the way. The agents then placed the cashet in an awaiting Navy arbulance.

0. I also placed a joint eight man Arry, Air Force Cordon leading to the entrance of President Johnson's helicopter. These on were proopned to over after the two (2) joint teams were Tamed.
