50,000 JFK documents shed little new light

Nearly 50,000 documents released Tuesday by the National Archives shed little new light on the assassination of President Kennedy, officials said. Among the material: photos of the bloodstained limousine and autopsy X-rays of Kennedy's skull. About 1 million documents have been released under 1992 legislation requiring federal agencies to make public all records relating to the assassination. At least 100,000 CIA documents and more than 100 boxes of FBI material remain sealed, awaiting official review.
