Compromise Seen for 9 At Southern

BATON ROUGE, La. (AP) — Compromise appeared near today in a suit filed by Southern University administrators to bar nine student protest leaders from the Baton Rouge campus.

Attorneys for the university and the nine students conferred with each other Wednesday, then with state Dist. Judge Lewis Doherty. They were to get together again this morning, before the resumption of the hearing.

There was speculation university officials would allow the students to return to classes—but only with the understanding that they are not to disrupt the academic process.

Doherty said attorneys had agreed to call no further witnesses.

Several Southern instructors testified Wednesday that student boycotters entered classrooms in an effort to swell their ranks.
