It deals with the period of time and events prior to President Kennedy's arrival at Love Field in Dallas and up until the time he was pronounced dead at the Parkland Remorial Mospital in Dallas. Mr. Dishop writes in-a descriptive narrative style describing events and actions of principals who became involved in the assassination. He still maintains a great admiration for President and Mrs. Kennedy throughout this installment. This installment has numerous references to the Director, FbI, and Fully ersonnel. In addition, Er.
