Along Broadway today, demonstrators protesting the conspiracy trials of the "Chicago Seven" and the "Panther 21" clashed with police after an orderly march and rally by 5,000.

At least one demonstrator was taken into custody. There were no immediate reports of injuries, but plate glass windows were broken in three banks and several stores.

The clashes occurred after the demonstrators marched 18 blocks from 42nd Street down Fifth Avenue to Madison Square Park.
