

Around the Nation**Cleaver to Seek
Interracial Front**

Black Panther leader-in-exile Eldridge Cleaver said he hopes to form a coalition with anti-Establishment whites to "tear down the system, not with fire, not with guns—but with solid political and scientific know-how."

Cleaver repeated he intends to return to San Francisco, which he fled when his parole was revoked for taking part in a Panther-police incident.

"I'm going back home," Cleaver said.

"You can't fight pigs with eloquence, I've got to physically commit myself."

Cleaver, Panther minister of information, discussed the black revolutionary movement in a Life magazine interview with photographer Gordon Parks, who visited him in his small house outside Algiers.

The interview was published even as 16 Black Panthers prepared to go on trial today in New York on charges of plotting to kill policemen and dynamite rail lines and major department stores during last Easter's shopping season.
