Suspect Surrenders

LOS ANGELES — The second of two brothers sought in the slaying of two Black Panthers on the

UCLA campus was booked on suspicion of murder after he surrendered to police at San Diego.

Larry Joseph Stiner, 21, was suffering from a shoulder wound that a policeman said "looks three days old." He was flown to the UCLA Medical Center and the bullet was removed before he was placed in the jail ward.

His brother, George Philhip Stiner, 22, turned himself in at the West Los Angeles station on Monday.

The Stiner brothers are UCLA students who are members of US, a rival organization to the Black Panthers.

The two Black Panthers were shot to death after a meeting of black nationalist groups called to settle differences over the running of UCLA's proposed Afro-American Center.
